PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

- X Students should work through questions independently
- Does not assess reading level
- * Assesses phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary
- Identifies gaps in learning
- X Identifies a level where students can work independently





Student Dashboard (Login)

- Allows students to track progress toward personalized goals.
- · Promotes awareness and ownership of performance and progress.
- · At the start of each session, the student sees this information:
 - · This week's usage goal
 - This week's progress toward the usage goal
 Minutes needed to meet usage goal
 This week's number of units completed







3-Step Instructional Branching

Instructional units adapt based on each student's individual performance

- Standard This is the first step in a unit.
 If students complete it successfully, they progress through the activity.
- Guided Practice This step is reached if errors are made at Standard and includes scaffolded practice based on those errors. If successful, the student returns to Standard.
- Instruction This step is reached if errors are made in Guided Practice and provides explicit instruction and practice. Upon completion of this step, the student returns to Standard.





Student Dashboard (Logout)

- · Displays individual progress toward achieving weekly usage goal.
- Allows students to self-monitor progress toward individual goals.
- · At the end of each session, the student sees this information:
 - This session's number of minutes gained

 - This session's number of units gained
 Updated progress toward weekly usage goal
 Updated number of units completed this week
