SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

Language Arts Performance

Target: The percent of students scoring a 4 or 5 on PARCC will increase from 40% to 53%. The percent of ELL students scoring a 4 or 5 on PARCC will increase from 24% to 39.2%.

Strategies:

- Focus on first-instruction and the implementation of grade level standards supported by the RST and the ESOL Team.
- Use data discussions around student performance to make informed decisions about the focus of instruction for the targeted group (ELL) in collaboration with RST, interventionists, and other staff.
- PD on specific targeted professional learning that increases student engagement in quality interactions through speaking for the targeted group (ELL).

Mathematics Performance

Target: The percent of students scoring a 4 or 5 on PARCC will increase from 37.6% to 49.2%. The percent of ELL students scoring a 4 or 5 on PARCC will increase from 25% to 32%.

Strategies:

- Schedule structured time for teachers to collaboratively plan with a focus on first instruction and the implementation of grade level standards supported by the RST and the ESOL Team.
- Use data discussions around student performance to make informed decisions about the focus of instruction for the targeted group (ELL) in collaboration with RST, interventionists, and other staff.
- PD on specific targeted professional learning that increases student engagement in quality interactions through speaking for the targeted group (ELL).
